Dear Friends of St Theosevia's,

Thank you for supporting last term's programme. As well as the two Study Days a pleasant evening was spent with bring-and-share contributions of music and poetry on the subject of Prayer, including some notable original compositions.

We begin the Trinity Term programme with a Memorial Evening for Canon Donald Allchin, organized by Metropolitan Kallistos of Diokleia, at which all are welcome, both those who knew Donald and those who did not.

This is followed by two Study Days. The first, on Saturday 28 May, will take us to Cyprus in the eastern Mediterranean.. We have just installed new blackout curtains, from which Nicholas Gendle's excellent slides should benefit.

The second Day takes us to the Black Sea and beyond, to Georgia and Armenia, with talks by Professor Theo van Lint, Calouste Gulbenkian Professor of Armenian Studies; by Nikoloz Aleksidze who is one of his graduate students; and by Archbishop Malkhaz Songulashvili, TSSF, Head of the Evangelical Baptist Church in Georgia, Anglican Franciscan tertiary, and researcher at Regent's Park College..

It is notable that this year the date of Western and Eastern Easter coincides on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> April, so that Trinity Term begins, remarkably, one week later on May Day, Sunday 1st May, and ends with the Nativity of St John the Baptist on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June. St John's College is named after the Baptist, and you are very welcome to attend a Eucharist for the Feast, in St John's Chapel on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June, probably at 6pm.

### **Memorial Evening Meeting for Canon Donald Allchin**

Canon Donald Allchin (1930-2010) who died two days before last Christmas, was for seven years the first Director of the St Theosevia Centre for the Study of Christian Spirituality. His friends will meet to share their memories of his life and his many-sided work. Speakers include Metropolitan Kallistos and Esther de Waal. All who knew Donald are invited to come and contribute their reminiscences. Those who did not know him personally are also most welcome to participate. A glass of wine will be served.

### **The Byzantine Churches of Cyprus: Art and Architecture**

Illustrated talks with Dr Nicholas Gendle

The island of Cyprus contains a remarkable number of Orthodox churches and monasteries dating from the sixth to the fifteenth centuries. Some are architecturally significant, notably the peculiarly Cypriot five-domed churches; but the most celebrated painted churches are small buildings with outstanding Byzantine frescos, eleventh/twelfth centuries, in the beautiful setting of the Troodos Mountains. ### **Georgia and Armenia : Christian Identities and Spirituality in the Caucasus**

Professor Theo van Lint, Nikoloz Aleksidze, Archbishop Malkhaz Songulashvili

**Professor van Lint** will present a 13th-14th Armenian poet's spiritual *vademecum* and its context of a lay brotherhood in Anatolia. The poet is called Kostandin of Erzinka, and Erzinka is the Erzincan of today. **Nicholoz Aleksidze** will speak on 'Doctrine, Identity and Memory in the Early Christian Caucasus', on the formation of Armenian and Georgian identity in the first centuries of Christianity in the region, exploring how our knowledge of that period is distorted by centuries of polemics between the Armenian and Georgian Churches, and how the national Christian tradition was shaped in the light of these polemics. **Archbishop Malkhaz** speaks on 'Ancient Faith and Fresh Expressions of Church Life and Ministry in Georgia', offering some visual materials about the contextual evolution of the Evangelical Baptist Church of Georgia in relation with Orthodox culture and spiritual legacy.
